

Information sheet on continued insurance

When your international insurance policy through GIZ ends, you have the option of taking out continued insurance with Hallesche and continuing your health insurance at comparable rates (domestic rates, international rates, supplementary health insurance for person with statutory insurance).

Continued insurance is not a short-term transitional solution but provides a basis for longterm cover.

A health check is required in order to prepare a binding continued insurance offer. This may result in risk surcharges or exclusions from cover.

DR-WALTER tip: To facilitate the process, we strongly recommend that you provide all necessary health data when you join the group insurance scheme.

The following documents are required for the health check:

1. Declaration of the State of Health
2. Copy of the tropical medical examination (TMU including laboratory tests) carried out before departure.
3. Declaration of consent for the processing of personal data by DR-WALTER.

The health information provided in the health declaration **must refer to the date of registration** with the GIZ international group insurance policy. This has the advantage that changes in health status during the term of the international group insurance policy may not be considered by the insurer for the health assessment of the continued insurance conditions.

In addition, the following documents are required at the end of the assignment abroad:

1. Cancellation of the GIZ international health insurance
2. Analysis sheet for continued insurance coverage

Continued insurance must be applied for within **two months** of the end of the group contract entitlement and must follow on **seamlessly** from the international group contract.
